*"Stop violence against ALL women!  
Implementation of the Istanbul Convention:  
UNCONDITIONALLY!"*

Since February 1, 2018, the convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence—also known as the **"Istanbul Convention" (IC)**—is in force in Germany. The IC understands violence against women both as human rights violation and a form of discrimination. Additionally, it defines violence against women not only on a physical and mental basis but also focuses on the consequences which derive from sexist and sexual actions, such as economic consequences. By the understanding of gender as a social construct and the fact of equality for EVERYONE and ANYONE, the convention reveals concrete missions. The IC speaks explicitly within the voice of women's movement: "the personal is political." Moreover, vice versa: the political is personal; violence against women as well as sexual and reproductive self-determination cannot be tabooed, or even should not be sexist and racial reinterpreted and instrumentalized.

The conference highlights the perspectives, concerns, and needs of women with a history of migration and force-displacement as a refugee. On September 6, 2019, together with representatives from politics, media, and civil society focussing on women and migration policies, we will

discuss the Istanbul Convention's objectives, targets, and its previous actions. Additionally, we will elaborate the current status of the implementation and update the catalog of demands in 2017; "No to violence against migrant and refugee women" (*Nein zu Gewalt an Migrantinnen\* und geflüchtete Frauen\**, 2017).

The Istanbul Convention is a suitable basis to implement women rights and human rights in Germany for **EVERYBODY and ANYBODY comprehensively and unconditionally**. Paragraph 59 of the convention is a particular segment regarding the rights of women and girls with a history of migration and forced displacement as a refugee. However, the Federal Government of Germany has only ratified the convention with reservation of article 59 (2) and 59(3).

The core questions for us: By whom and how will the obstacles for migrant and refugee women be addressed and incorporated into the GREVIO-questionnaire? Will the consequences, especially regarding residence permit status, residence arrangements and "Ehebestandszeit" (the duration of marriage), play an appropriate role? Which stakeholders will be addressed or respectively involved in the implementation process, regarding marginalized groups, multiple-discriminated people, and topics of taboo? What about illegalized women and survivors of human trafficking? Moreover, how the concerns and protection concepts of women living in central accommodation (initial reception centers for asylum seekers, collective centers, AnKER-Zentren) will be heard?

In this framework, DaMigra is addressing central issues for policy-making at their annual conference: because the Istanbul Convention stands for human rights and thus for migrant women's rights!

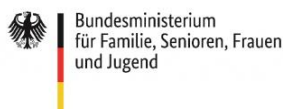
